### **We are nothing without you!**

Montgomery's Kids is about to celebrate three years of service to our county's foster care community. To date we have been able to fill 240 requests for children in foster care as well as youth aging out of care. With your help we have sent over 50 children to summer camp and paid for boxing lessons, dancing lessons, new boots, computers, and driving lessons - just to name a few.

That is the very good news. The not so good news is that the number of children going into the child welfare system is increasing and the youth aging out of care are finding it increasingly difficult to find affordable housing, transportation and other supports in Montgomery County.

The needs of these older youth are often more costly - security deposits, car repairs and furniture - not to mention the psychological toll of losing their support system. But so far WE (that's all of us) have been able to fill many of the requests we get.

### **Spotlight on Youth**



M is a twenty-year old student at the University of Maryland who has been in and out of foster homes all her life. Still she is pursuing a degree in criminology with the goal of becoming a parole officer. She also works full time while going to school and just found an internship in the criminal justice field that will help her gain experience to meet her goal.

Montgomery's Kids helped her pay for books and paid for parking at school so she could more easily get to her classes and her job. Helping a young person as tenacious as M allows her to focus on the bigger picture, getting good grades and succeeding in school.



R entered foster care at a young age. She loves to dance wants to meet friends and be part of the school community by taking dance lessons. R needed dance apparel to participate and we were able to help her feel like all her fellow dancers.

One of the more unusual requests we received has been to help a young man fulfill his dream of entering a cyber security program in the military. To be accepted he cannot have tattoos. We are helping him pay to have a rose tattoo removed from his hand.

Starting out in the world as a young adult is a daunting task, and those “graduating” from foster care have very limited financial and social support to assist the transition into independent living. Jane Steinberg and Alan Kraut, two psychologists, met a young woman through Montgomery’s Kids, and were very impressed by all that she had accomplished during her transition. She was working two jobs while



starting college as a psychology major. And then, her car went caput, and she badly needed funds for a an apartment security deposit. To help her get through this very tough time, Jane and Alan provided funds via Montgomery’s Kids to repair the car (which was needed to get to college and work) and then to cover the first and last month’s rent. The couple also arranged for a summer internship in a psychology organization. This young woman earned a glowing recommendation from the organization’s Executive Director, an important credential for future employment. Thanks to this young woman’s tenacity and intelligence, as well as financial and networking help from Jane and Alan, she is well along her way to meeting her goals.
